DESCRIPTION

This is a dynamic 3 Day (24-hour) course for law enforcement leaders of all ranks, building skills for rapid, principled decisions before, during, and after critical incidents. We'll cover managing crises like active shooters, hostage situations, barricades, and major crime scenes, plus aftermath challenges: line-of-duty injuries/deaths, family notifications, media/political dynamics, litigation, and officer wellness.

Through discussions, group exercises, debriefs, workshops, and scenario-driven learning with videos and audio, participants gain proven strategies for strong retention and practical use. Students apply tools to realistic scenarios, mastering risk mitigation, safety, de-escalation, and recovery leadership. Students receive checklists, command forms, and a Critical Incident Response Guide.

A complete system for managing critical incidents from first call to conclusion, emphasizing:

- Establishing and maintaining command
- Making confident, defensible decisions under pressure
- Mitigating risk while protecting personnel and the community
- Leading the recovery, not just the response

Ultimately, this course equips leaders to confidently handle chaos and aftermath, improving high-stakes outcomes.
